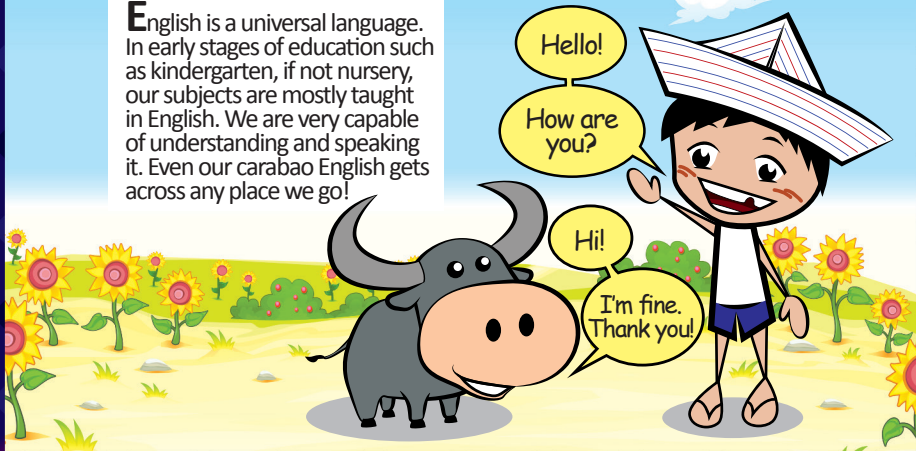




Ang Pilipino ay

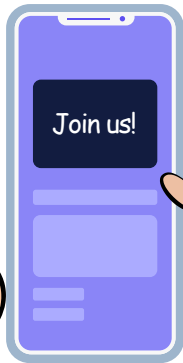
